- 13:00 recreation, dances
- 15:30 train stopped for hay, grain, potatoes at Verdemont station
- 17:00 started a fire in straw
- 19:15 heard a mountain lion, saw rattle snake
- 20:30 dad died, quit school, the depression, raised hogs, traded for fruit, traded potatoes at Blizzardine homestead, dad buried in Catholic cemetery
- 26:45 mother remarried after 9 years
- 30:00 dances at Abbott Lodge, married Ray Vickerman, a cook at Alpine Lodge, Fred Squire tied his car to a tree All moved together to ranch
- 33:30 Moved together to the ranch
- 33:50 raising sheep

- 39:00 shivaree dance
- 40:45 Fred Squire worked mines in Central City, got engaged, marriage
- beginning side 2 of tape, Myrtle married Eddy Cody; reading from a document about Cody family from Ireland (Fellows), article from "Reflections...", the Degree family
